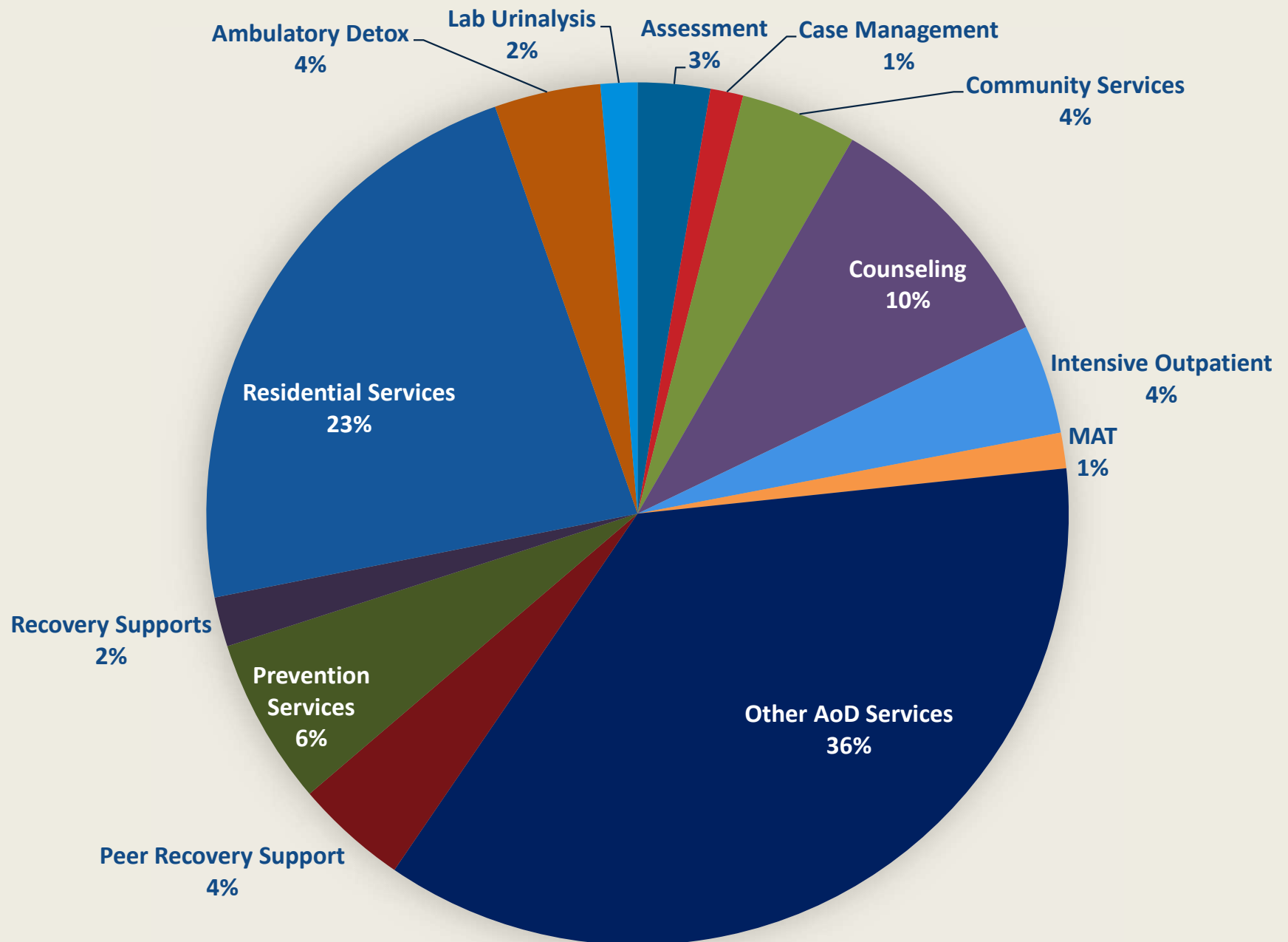
Mental Health & Recovery Services Board

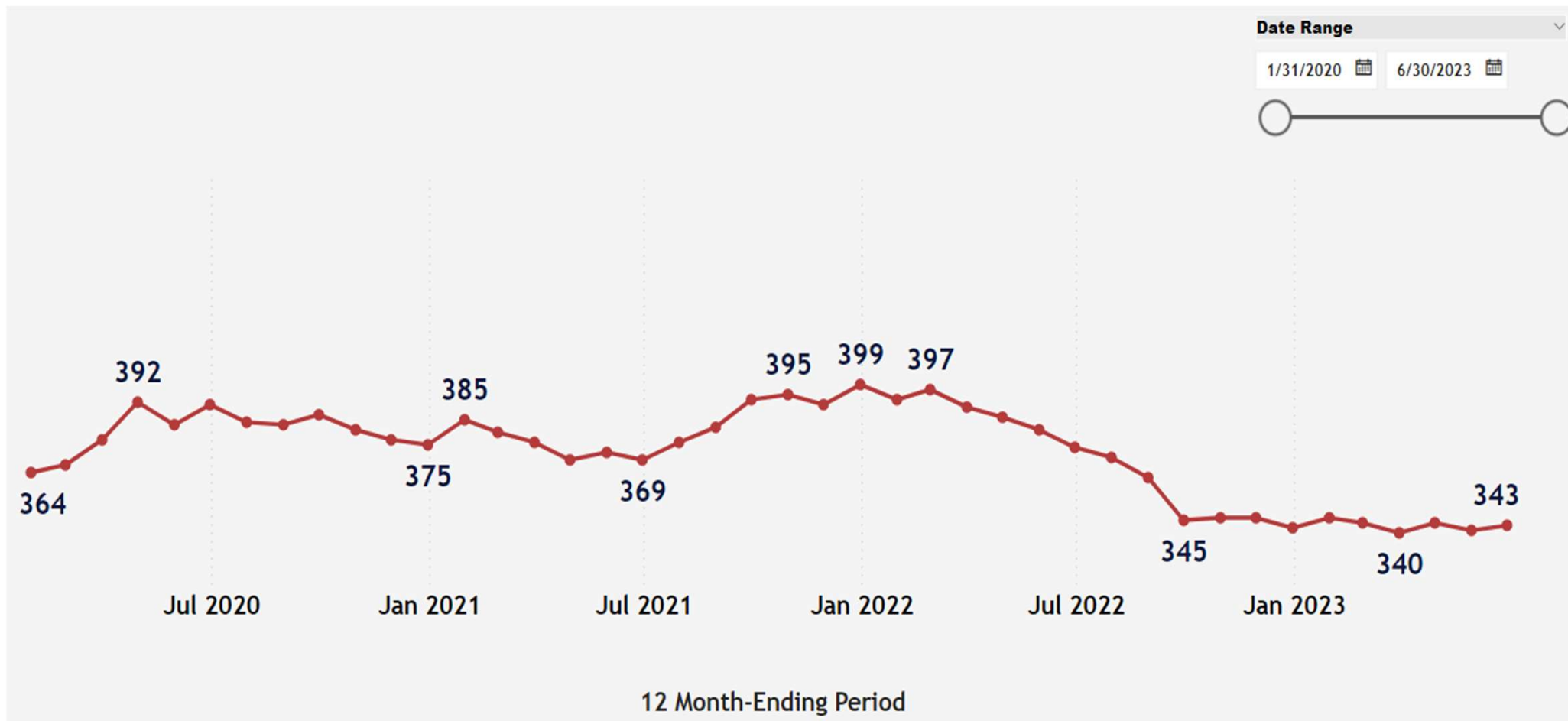
AOD Revenue by Source

Worried about care for his 2 young sons

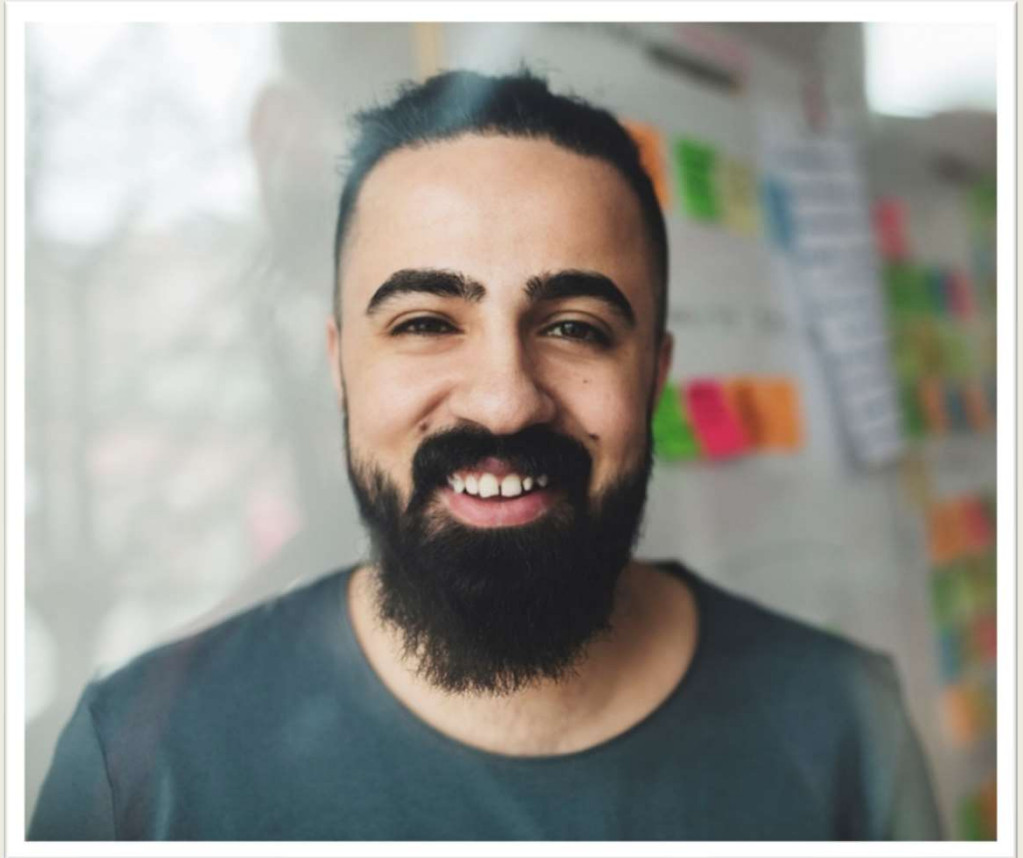
Accepted a 90-day placement at 1617 Reading Road

Coach connected Ben to ongoing treatment services

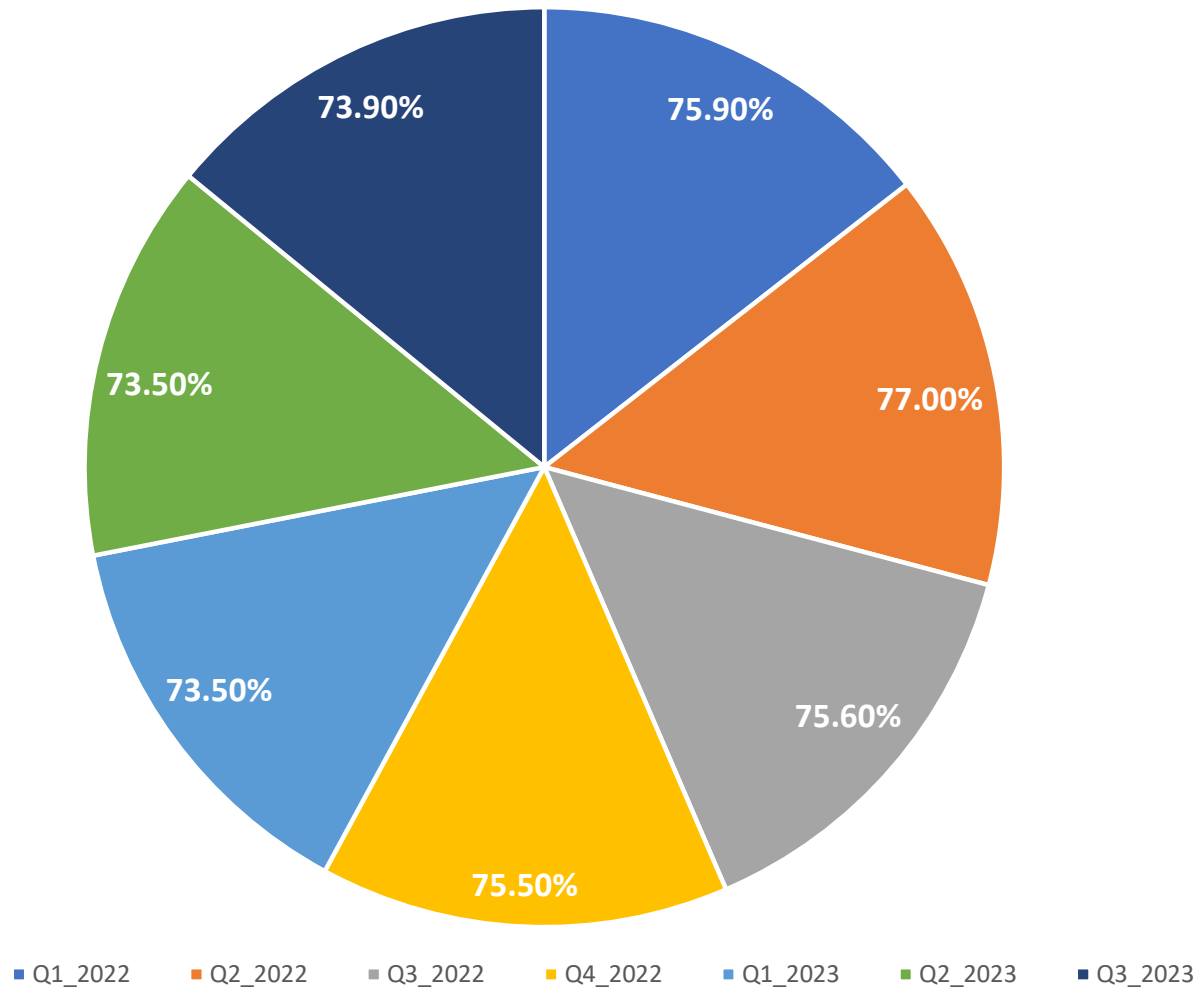
Ben is currently drug free and caring for his sons

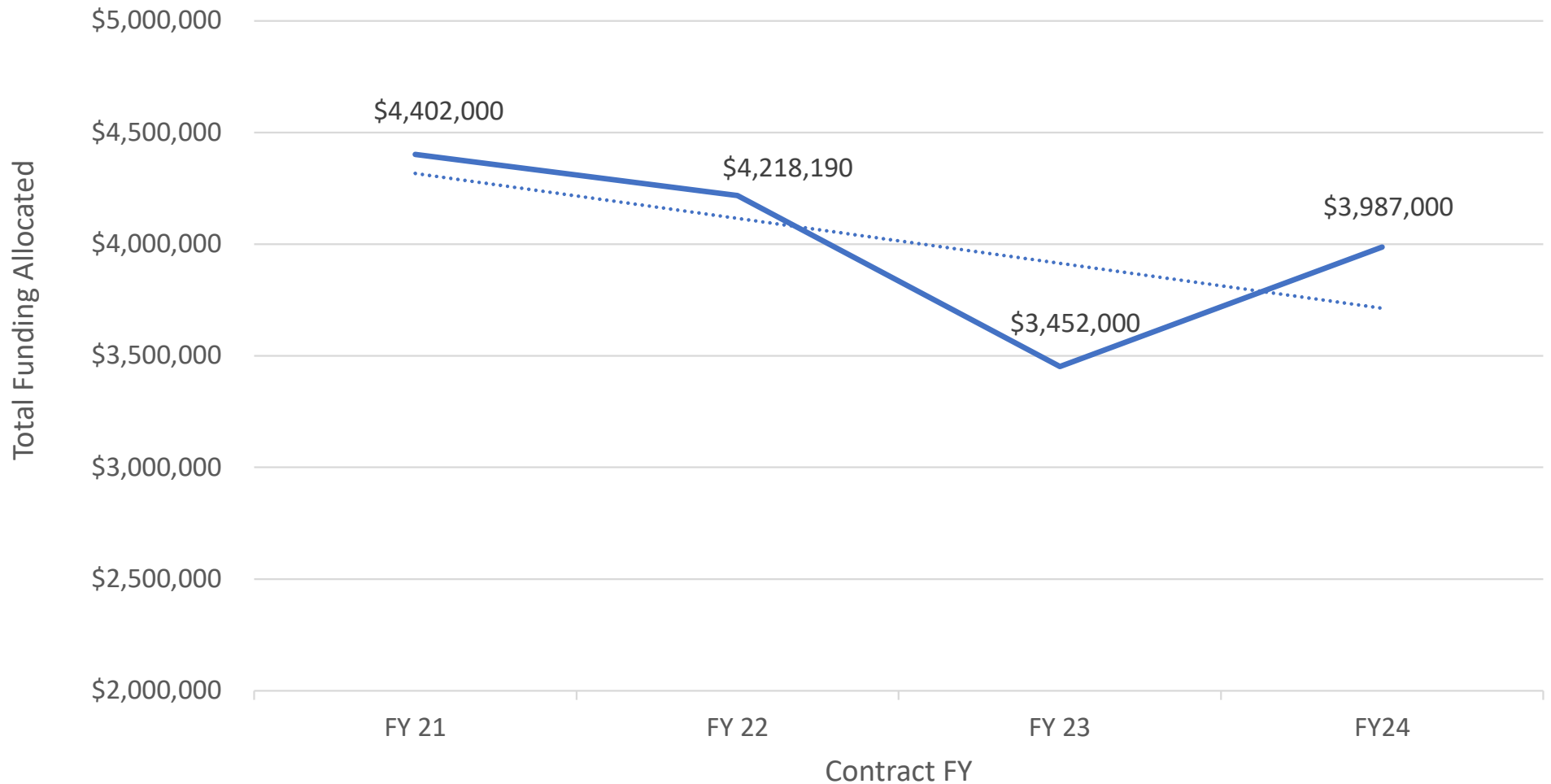

Changes within the Levy cycle

- Closure of the Turning Point Program, due to staffing issues at Hamilton County Sheriff's Department(HCSD)
- Change of intake and administrative duties within the Hamilton Co. Drug Treatment & Recovery Court
- Shift of allocated funds to recovery supports for the Hamilton Co. Drug Treatment & Recovery Court
- Closure of a men's residential unit and pending closure of women's
- Significant facility upgrades at 1617 Reading Rd.
- Creation of the Hamilton Co. Municipal Recovery Docket w/Judge Bender
- Closure of Central Community Health Board
- Sale of the ADAS center and pending relocation

Drug Treatment & Recovery Court

\$1,152,000

Talbert House provides services to referrals made by the court in three areas. Located at 3009 Burnet Ave (ADAS Center). Individuals can move through the continuum based on need.

1. Residential: serves clients whose living situations or recovery environments do not support their recovery goals referred by Hamilton County Drug Treatment & Recovery Court . It is appropriate for individuals who need time and structure to practice and integrate their recovery and coping skills in a supportive environment.

Level of Care: Clinically Managed Low Intensity Residential Services

- Services include residential placement and treatment
- Focusing on Substance abuse and Criminogenic needs of the client
- Residential living
- 24/7 support and supervision by trained staff
- Vocational support, Medication Management, Primary Care, Peer Recovery and Discharge planning

Drug Treatment & Recovery Court continued.....

2. Outpatient Services: serves clients who are in the community who do not meet the criteria for the residential level of care and can be served in the community on an outpatient basis. Outpatient services are a critical tool to help Drug Court clients maintain existing housing, employment and/or parenting arrangements while getting the treatment that they need to be successful.

Levels of Care

- Medication (MAT/MOUD)
- Intensive Outpatient Services
 - Multiple contacts per week in a group and individual therapy
 - Case Management
 - Peer Recovery Coaches
- Traditional Outpatient Services
 - Assessment
 - Group and Individual Therapy

3. **Recovery Supports:** resources to assist and support clients in recovery, facilitated by Peer Recovery Coaches

Services Provided

- ✓ Housing: Transitional and Recovery Housing
- ✓ Emergency basic needs and Recovery Supports(ID, Security dep., Food, Sup. Employment)
- ✓ Peer Recovery:
 - assist with developing a recovery-oriented lifestyle
 - relapse prevention education
 - assist clients in decreasing the barriers to treatment
 - increasing access to treatment.
 - reduce continued use and increase long term recovery.
- ✓ Transportation

1617 Jail Based Treatment

\$2,300,000

150 bed jail based treatment facility located at 1617 Reading Rd. Serving males and females referred by the Hamilton Co. Courts

- Provides substance abuse treatment to both male and female clients who have been incarcerated in the Hamilton County Justice Center for drug/alcohol related offenses.
- Uses a milieu management approach combined with cognitive-behavioral therapy to help offenders learn to recognize triggers.
- Offenders learn coping strategies to deal with people, places, and situations from staff and peers in a group setting and cognitive restructuring tools.
- Offenders are taught how to develop healthy behaviors and habits.
- SUD programming incorporates various therapeutic techniques, including individual and group behavioral counseling and medical intervention.
- Additional supportive services include parenting, anger management, healthy relationships, trauma, and grief due to loss.
- Aftercare and discharge planning that includes Peer Recovery coaches

Recovery Docket

\$535,000

Created in April of 2023 the Hamilton County Recovery Docket provides a comprehensive, coordinated, and non-adversarial docket to criminal cases selected in Hamilton County Municipal Court. This is a new program started in collaboration with Judge Bender, Pretrial, Probation, Talbert Houses and the Public Defenders Officer. Provides a Court Liaison and multiple Peer Recovery coaches along with Recovery supports (Judge Ginocchio now oversees)

- ✓ Serves individuals with a current substance use disorder and an active case with the Hamilton County Municipal Court.
- ✓ Provides supportive services and treatment to decrease recidivism, address their substance use needs, and improve their quality of life.
- ✓ Removes barriers to treatment by supporting individual needs
- ✓ Participation in the docket is voluntary.
